	<p>Mr Ian Harvey commenced his role as Medical Director on 1st July 2012. Ian qualified in Medicine in Liverpool and took up a post as Consultant Trauma and Orthopaedic Surgeon with an interest in upper limb and hand surgery in the Trust in August 1994., Ian was Divisional Medical Director for Planned Care and his other managerial roles in the Trust have included Lead Clinician for Orthopaedics and Clinical Director for Orthopaedic and Plastic Surgery and Rheumatology. Mr Harvey was one of the first surgeons in the Mersey Region to perform arthroscopic surgery of the shoulder. He also performs arthroscopic surgery of the wrist and elbow and upper replacement surgery.</p> <p>Mr Harvey is a Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh, the British Society for Surgery of the Hand (BSSH) and British Shoulder Elbow Society (BESS). <p>This speciality provides support for children in the community until they leave school, with particular attention being paid to special needs, both social and educational. It includes Child Health Surveillance, Secondary Care for children with developmental problems, School Nursing, and Audiology.</p> <p>In addition, this service also has statutory responsibilities for Child Protection, Adoption and Fostering, and oversees the immunisation programme.</p> <p>The Child Development Centre at Moston Lodge provides multi-disciplinary assessment and therapy for the under-fives in conjunction with the Education Authority and Social Services.</p>
