>> I have been given your contact details by Sue Eardley at the RCPCH as someone who might be able to assist us in a detailed case note review of a number of neonatal deaths and near misses. This is one of the early recommendations following a College invited review which was stimulated by our clinicians highlighting an increase in the number of deaths in our neonatal unit in 2015 and 2016. They also highlighted concerns about the mode of death of some of these babies, in that they seemed to not respond to normal resuscitation measures as they would have anticipated.

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>> The invited review team have made a recommendation of detailed review and examination to be carried out together with a relevant paediatric pathologist by two independent specialists reporting separately. It is likely that the review would extend to a maximum of 13 deaths and between four and six significant near misses.
