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At no time did Lucy tell me anything which required me to contact someone more senior in the hospital

or the police, I work under a strict code where if anyone ever tells me anything that is harmful to

themselves or others then I will disclose it to others.

I have documented in my notes after meetings with Lucy the general coping advice I gave to her. The

notes are all to do with Lucy's welfare, supporting her the best I could during an extraordinary difficult

time.

Lucy did ask for meetings with me on anniversaries of some of the babies deaths as she was particularly

distressed. Lucy informed me that's why she had come to see me as she was having a bad week. No

specific names were mentioned and the day of the meeting in my notes would be around an anniversary

date of one of the deaths. During these meetings Lucy did speak to me about the parents of the babies.

She felt distressed and upset, but how much more distressed and upset the parents must be feeling

because they had lost their babies. These conversations were around the times of the anniversary dates,

probably July 2017. Lucy did not mention any parents in particular.

She also talked often about the consultants involved; she couldn't understand why they were accusing

her. She thought they must hate her so much to do this to her.

She talked about consultants Ravi Jayaram and Stephen Brearey.

I did not document the reason for these visit from Lucy in my notes, I documented the coping strategies

given to Lucy.

I feel privileged at being asked to support Lucy over such a lengthy period and to support Lucy over these

very hard times for her. The whole process was very difficult for me, especially with the process taking so

long.
