2 Effective		 The National Neonatal audit shows the Countess of Chester Hospital met the NNAP standard for three out of five indicators. They did not meet the standard for 100% of eligible babies receiving ROP screening and the proportion of babies receiving their mothers milk upon discharge from the neonatal unit. There is one active 'for follow-up' maternity outlier at this trust: Puerperal sepsis and other puerperal infections The standardised caesarean section rates are similar to expected for this trust.
