# Medical Examiner System - chronology

#### 2003

"..the Medical Examiner system in England and Wales was introduced as a result of the Government's response to the recommendations following Dame Janet Smith's recommendations in her third report from the Inquiry into the murders committed by Harold Shipman." [INQ0014570 Statement of Dr Alan Fletcher para. 12]

Dame Janet Smith's third report: "Death Certification and the Investigation of Deaths by Coroners" published 14 July 2003.

#### 2004

March 2004 Home Office publish position paper "Reforming the Coroner and Death Certification Service."

"This Home Office position paper proposed that all deaths be referred to a second certifier, who would be a medical examiner: a qualified doctor employed by the new coroner service." [INQ0014570 Statement of Dr Alan Fletcher para. 14]

## 2008

"On 1 March 2008, a pilot scheme for a medical examiner system started in Sheffield." [INQ0014570 Statement of Dr Alan Fletcher para.17]

#### 2016-2018

Consultations on medical examiner system

### 2019

Dr Alan Fletcher appointed as National Medical Examiner for England and Wales.

#### 2019/20

"In 2019/2020, the National Medical Examiner's national and regional teams were appointed." [INQ0014570 Statement of Dr Alan Fletcher para.25]

### 2021

"In June 2021, all acute NHS Trusts reported that they had established medical examiner offices." [INQ0014570 Statement of Dr Alan Fletcher para.28]

## 2024

9 September 2024 Statutory Medical Examiner System came into force.

Dr Alan Flecher became National Medical Examiner for England and Wales (Statutory position)
